

BRAGAS Braies

Defining Features

- short & closely fitted • Longer & fuller

- Two primary styles • Linen, always white • Tied at waist
- Sometimes decorated at seamlines



CAMISA Shirt

Defining Features

- Full through the body
- Wide sleeves were predominant
- Long enough to tuck into breeches
- Always white
- Usually linen, but sometimes silk or wool
- Neckline could be round or square, or
 - gathered into a collar
- Sometime cuffs
- Sometimes highly decorated at collar and






Altarpiece of San Vicente, Bernard Martorell. First half of the 16th century



JUBÓN Doublet

Defining Features

- Worn over shirt
- Attached to hosen or calzas bragas with lacing • Round, square, high, or Vneck
- Closely fitted
- Made of fustian, wool, linen, cotton (padding)
- Castilian style = narrow sleeves, French style
 - = wide sleeves
- soldiers or laborers
- Not generally seen in public except on



CALZAS Hosen

Defining Features • Common styles:

- or velvet

• split with codpiece • short to thigh or knee • joined between legs • Sometimes soled with leather • Cut on the bias for stretch • Usually wool or leather • After 15th c. usually knitted • Decorated with bands or panels of wool, silk,

CALZAS-BRAGAS Breech hose

Defining Features

- Separate breeches
- Sometimes laced to jubon
- Highly decorated
- Long enough to reach top of hosen
- hosen

• Sometimes found with lacing holes to attach

• Generally covered with doublet skirt Influenced by German Landsknecht fashion

SAYO Jerkin **Defining Features**

- Full through the body
- Long skirts to knee or mid thigh
- Skirts cartridge pleated for fullness
- Open down front
- Round, square, or collared at neckline
- Decorated with slashes or bands of silk, wool,
 - or velvet

- Made of silk, wool, silk brocade, or velvet
 - padded with cotton, linen, or silk wadding

• richer jerkins decorated with gems, metail pieces, or embroidery








